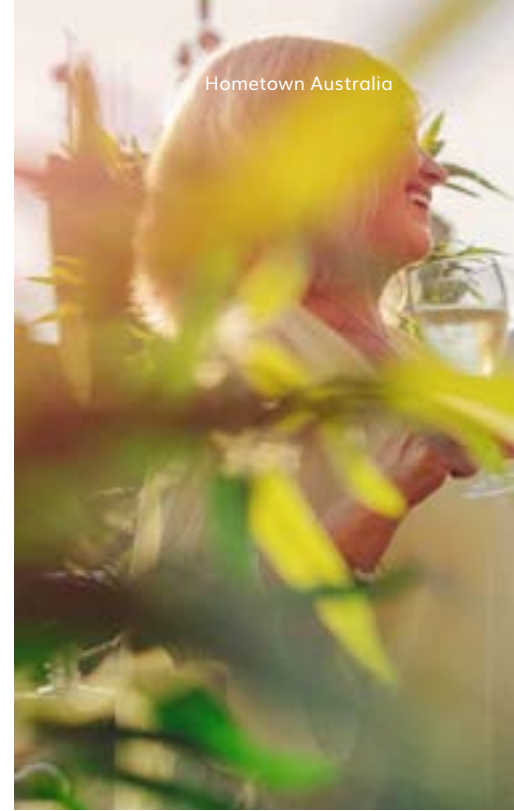

Discovering the Untouched Beauty of Hervey Bay

Hervey Bay is a popular holiday destination on the Fraser Coast in Queensland. It is less than a 4-hour drive from Brisbane and offers so much for the adventure seekers as well as for people looking for a relaxing break in a beautiful warm climate. With pristine beaches, spectacular coastal views and a relaxed ambience, Hervey Bay has become a popular option for retirees to spend their retirement years.

The Natural Environment

Hervey Bay is recognised as the world's first official Whale Heritage Site. Between June and November thousands of humpback whales can be seen off the Fraser coastline on their migration from Antarctica. While views of whales breaching are fabulous from the land, there are also

numerous whale watching tours available to get up close to these magnificent creatures.

The Hervey Bay Botanic Gardens is another popular attraction in the Fraser Coast region. The gardens have been cultivated over a 26-hectare area and feature a diverse range of plant species

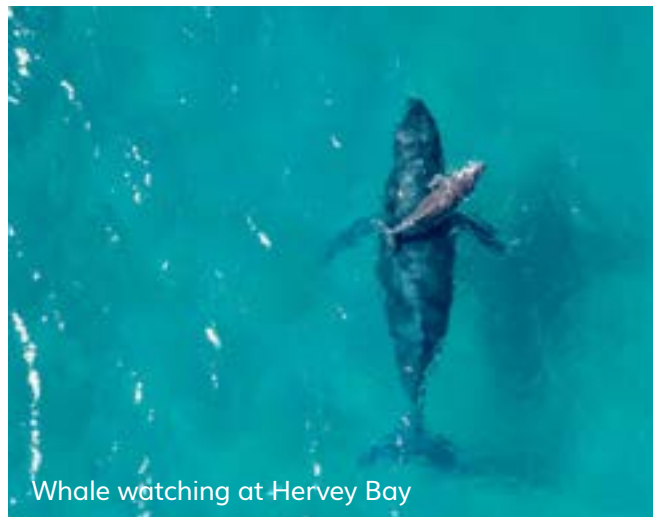
Retirement Living in Beautiful Hervey Bay

What are your interests outside of work?

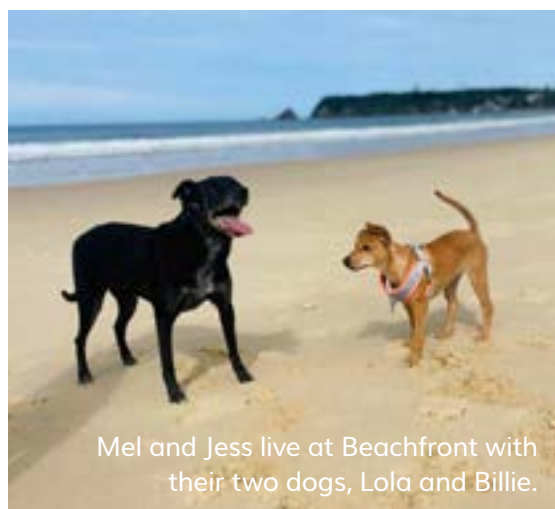

What are your career highlights so far?

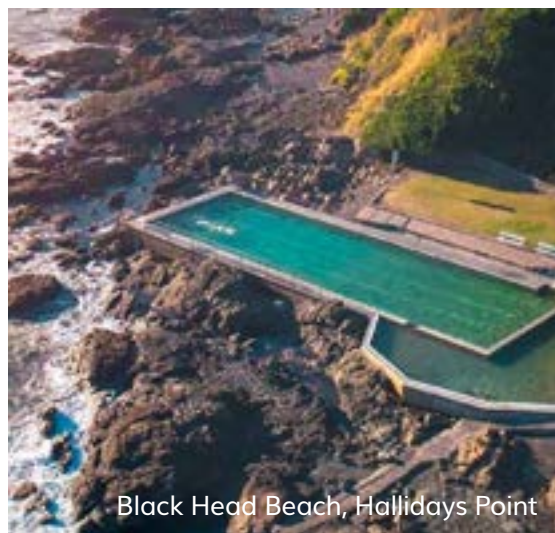

Visitors are enamoured with its secluded beaches, wetlands, and rich Aboriginal history. The streets of Goolwa have beautiful old sandstone buildings from the 1850s and the visitor centre is a good place to learn about the history of its river port and the culture of the Ngarrindjeri people.

A popular way to explore the lower Murray River and experience living history is to take a one hour cruise on a 103 year old paddle steamer!

The Fleurieu Peninsula is also a favourite spot for food lovers who are keen to sample its fresh produce and visit their popular restaurants, wineries, distilleries and breweries.

Hometown Australia's Seachange community is only a short distance from Goolwa beach and the river.

Seachange has a well-established community of homeowners who enjoy joining in a range of exercise and craft classes as well the busy calendar of social events.





This vibrant community is looking forward to some exciting plans for enhancing the community. Commencing in 2023, Seachange will undergo significant changes, with the addition of a wellness centre that will include an indoor heated pool, modern gymnasium, pickle ball courts, bowling green, clubhouse linking to outdoor terraces, BBQ area and dog park.

Hometown is delighted to announce that onsite civil works are planned to start mid-year with communal facilities commencing towards the end of the year, pending approvals.

Fundraising at Teraglin Lakeshore

When people work together, it's amazing what they can achieve.

15 years ago, John Smith, a homeowner at Teraglin Lakeshore, Chain Valley Bay, decided to raise funds for the Kids with Cancer Foundation by collecting, crushing and recycling cans. He also started a 'round Australia trek' where residents doing a daily walk would donate \$1 per kilometre to Kids with Cancer. Four years ago, Woolworths installed a 'hole in the wall', where recycled cans and bottles would earn a

ten cent return. Over the past 4 years they have recycled around 100,000 items. Each 10 cents received is donated to the Kids with Cancer Foundation with a lot of love and a sense of achievement.

Fruity Hot Cross Scones

Looking for a Hot Cross Bun with a twist? These wonderfully warming scones will fill your home with the autumnal aroma of pumpkin and spice - perfect for sharing at the Easter table.

Cooking time: 20 minutes

Serves 16 – 1 scone per serve

Ingredients

- ¾ cup mashed Jap pumpkin
- ½ cup fat-reduced milk
- 1 egg
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 2 teaspoons honey
- 2 cups wholemeal self-raising flour
- 1 cup self-raising flour
- 2 teaspoons mixed spice
- ¾ cup chopped dates
- 1/3 cup sultanas
- ¼ cup currants
- 100g ricotta and ¼ cup honey, to serve

Cross Topping:

- ¼ cup plain flour
- 2 tablespoon cold water

Glaze:

- 2 teaspoons honey

Method

1. Whisk pumpkin, milk, egg, oil and honey in a large jug.
2. Sift flours and spice, return husks remaining in sieve to the bowl. Add dates, sultanas and currants. Make well in centre. Add pumpkin mixture. Stir with a round-bladed knife to form a dough.
3. Turn dough onto a lightly floured surface. Knead until mixture comes together. Lightly flour hands, pat out dough until 2½ cm thick. Cut into rounds using 5.5 cm cutter, making 16 scones. Place on a lightly greased baking tray.
4. Cross topping. Form a

thick paste with flour and 2 tablespoons water. Spoon paste into a snaplock sandwich bag. Squeeze mixture into one corner of bag. Snip bag corner and pipe crosses over scones.

5. Bake. 190c oven (fan-forced) for 18-20 minutes, or until scones are evenly browned.

6. Glaze. Heat honey in microwave on high for 10 seconds, until hot. Brush over scones.

7. Serve. Split warm scones in half, lightly spread with ricotta and drizzle with a little honey.

8. Freeze individual scones up to 1 month in a freezer bag.

9. Heat from frozen. Microwave individual scones for about 20 seconds or heat in 160C oven (fan-forced) for 10-15 minutes wrapped in foil.

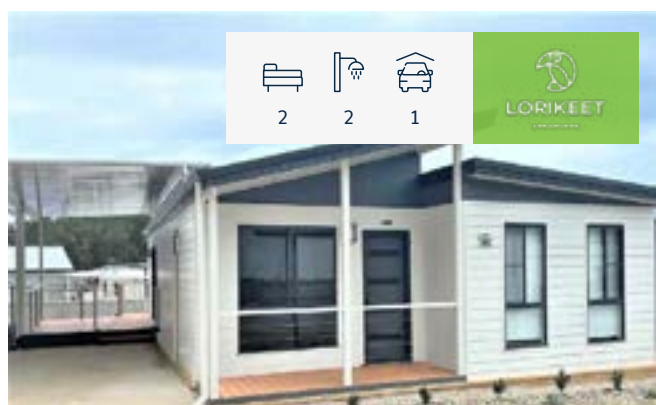

No council rates
