and packing into gift bags, an afternoon tea was held at the Sunrise community centre where Pastor Chris Klum from the local church, Hope UC, accepted the donations on behalf of Gifts of Hope. Hope UC has the infrastructure and community contacts in the Port Stephens, Hunter, and Central Coast areas to ensure that our donations make it to those in need," said Lynne.

Little Ray of Sunrise was first created in December 2022 as a few friends who had an idea to give back to the local community and has since grown into a group with over 80 members.
