ABOUT THE PARADE

PEOPLE + PASSION + PURPOSE

The Calgary Stampede Parade Committee exists to do one thing: showcase the Stampede to the world. We kick off The Greatest Outdoor Show on Earth by creating an entertaining, diverse, world-class parade that celebrates western spirit and culture. What that takes – year-round – is an organization built on clear values and a shared commitment to doing things the right way. We are over 200 dedicated volunteers. We log nearly 20,000 hours before Parade day even arrives. And when the last street sweeper leaves the route, we are already at work on next year's Parade.

PRESERVE THE PAST; EMBRACE THE FUTURE

The Calgary Stampede Parade has been running since September 2, 1912 – 114 years of unbroken tradition. We are the guardians of that legacy. Every decision we make is grounded in respect for what came before, while keeping one eye firmly on what comes next: new entries, new voices, new ways to reach audiences near and far.

CELEBRATE TOGETHER

The Parade Committee creates memorable experiences for participants and spectators alike—from the first drumbeat of the Prelude at 7:30 a.m. to the final street sweeper crossing the finish line. We believe the Parade belongs to everyone: the more than 300,000 people lining the route, the communities and nations who march, the volunteers who bring it to life, and the millions watching from home. Celebration and community are at the heart of everything we do.

LEAD WITH INTEGRITY

The Parade Committee works cooperatively with a wide range of stakeholders - The City of Calgary, Calgary Police Service, Fire Department, EMS, Roads, Transportation and Parks - to ensure the safe and logistical operation of the event. We earn the trust of our partners, our participants, our volunteers, and our audiences by doing what we say we will do, every single year.

STRIVE FOR EXCELLENCE

From adjudicating and selecting the most entertaining entries across floats, bands, Indigenous entries, community groups, and horse entries, to producing a world-class event through meticulous planning, coordination, lineup management, scripting, media, broadcast, timing, and pace - nothing about this Parade happens by accident. Every detail is deliberate. Every element is reviewed.

PUT PEOPLE AND ANIMALS FIRST

Over 700 horses. Hundreds of riders. Thousands of participants. Tens of thousands of spectators. Every one of them matters. Through the Parade Safety Sub-Committee, the Committee ensures the safety of participants and animals within the Parade through careful scrutiny of each entry and precautionary measures associated with the safety of all animals. When we say we put people and animals first, we mean it - it is built into our structure, our processes, and our culture.

WHO WE ARE

The Parade Committee is a year-round volunteer organization - one of the largest and most complex in Calgary. We are made up of over 200 dedicated volunteers, plus representatives appointed by various City of Calgary departments. Our volunteers come from all walks of life, united by a single shared belief: that this Parade matters, and that it is worth doing right. Many of our members have served for decades. The longest-serving have given 40, 50 years - and counting. That kind of commitment doesn't come from obligation. It comes from love.

Approximately 2 tons of manure will be deposited on the Parade route. Since 2001, the City of Calgary's "Street Sweeper Critters" – Chestnut the Horse, Barlow the Buffalo, Outlaw the Bull, and Daisy the Cow – have kept things tidy, joined by the Men in Kilts street sweepers.

2026 PARADE MARSHALS

We are thrilled to announce Team Canada Olympians Courtney Sarault and Mikael Kingsbury as the 2026 Calgary Stampede Parade Marshals! Representing excellence, resilience and Canadian pride on the world stage, Sarault and Kingsbury are among the country's most accomplished athletes, known for record-breaking performances, historic Olympic achievements and commitment to sport and community.

COURTNEY SARAUULT



A short track speed skater from Moncton, N.B., Courtney made history at the 2026 Milano Cortina Olympic Winter Games as the first Canadian short track speed skater to win four medals at a single Olympics and just the second Canadian athlete ever to capture four medals at one Winter Games. During the 2025/26 season, she also claimed the Crystal Globe as the top overall women's skater on the ISU Short Track World Tour after earning nine individual medals across four stops and helping Canada secure a second consecutive Team Crystal Globe.

"Attending the Calgary Stampede has long been a dream of mine, so the opportunity to take part as Parade Marshal is surreal and thrilling," says Courtney. "Calgary has been a big part of my journey – I trained in Calgary at the Olympic Oval for a few years, so Calgary has a really special place in my heart. I'm so excited to join everyone in this celebration."

MIKAËL KINGSBURY



Widely regarded as the greatest moguls skier of all time, Mikael has redefined excellence in freestyle skiing throughout his legendary career. The Quebec-born athlete holds more World Cup victories than any moguls skier in history, with 100 career wins, 29 Crystal Globes, nine World Championship titles and five Olympic medals, including two gold. At the 2026 Milano Cortina Olympic Winter Games, where he served as Canada's Opening Ceremonies flag bearer, he captured both gold and silver to become the most decorated male freestyle skier in Olympic history.

"I'm super excited and honoured to be Parade Marshal for the Calgary Stampede," says Mikael. "I've had a lot of success in Calgary throughout my career – my first World Cup start and the place where I have the most World Cup wins – so it holds a pretty special place in my heart. See you July 3 for The Greatest Outdoor Show on Earth!"

2026 CELEBRITY JUDGE

ANDREW PHUNG

The Calgary Stampede is thrilled to announce award-winning comedian, actor, producer and host Andrew Phung as the Celebrity Judge for the 2026 Calgary Stampede Parade presented by Suncor.

Known for his infectious energy, quick wit and deep Canadian roots, Phung will help kick off The Greatest Outdoor Show on Earth by taking part in one of Calgary's most cherished traditions on Parade Day – Friday, July 3.

"I'm a Northeast Calgary kid born and raised, and it's an absolute honour to come home and serve as celebrity judge for the Calgary Stampede Parade," said Andrew. "I remember attending the parade as a kid with my mom and grandparents, and it was always a highlight for me. Early mornings, wide eyes seeing the beautiful floats, and a belly full of syrup and pancakes."

As Celebrity Judge, Phung will review and help judge the many floats, marching bands and equestrian entries that make up the world-famous Stampede Parade. From his position along the parade route, he will help select winners in several categories, including the coveted Celebrity Judge's Choice Award. The role also includes engaging with parade crowds and participating in media appearances throughout the morning.

"We've wanted Andrew involved with the Calgary Stampede Parade for a long time and are incredibly excited we were able to make it happen this year," said Keith Marlowe, volunteer Stampede Parade Committee Chair. "He is a tremendous 'get' for us - funny, authentic, proud of his Canadian roots and absolutely oozing with personality. We know parade fans are going to love him."

Andrew has become one of Canada's most recognizable comedic performers. He is best known for his award-winning role as Kimchee on the hit CBC/Netflix series *Kim's Convenience*, earning five consecutive Canadian Screen Awards for Best Supporting Actor in a Comedy Series. He is also the co-creator, executive producer and star of the CBC and Hulu comedy *Run the Burbs*, for which he won the 2025 Canadian Screen Award for Best Lead Performer in a Comedy Series. His recent television credits also include *LOL: Last One Laughing Canada* on Amazon Prime, *Hate the Player* on Paramount+, and hosting duties on the Flavour Network's cooking competition series *Big Burger Battle*.



Murdoch Mysteries To Ride In The Parade !

Parade fans will also be treated to a special appearance by stars Yannick Bisson and Thomas Craig from CBC's hit series *Murdoch Mysteries*. The actors will participate in the parade aboard a *Murdoch Mysteries*-themed entry, celebrating the show's recent Calgary Stampede episode. Their appearance adds another uniquely Canadian element to this year's Parade and celebrates the enduring popularity of one of the country's most successful television dramas.

FROM THE PARADE TO THE MOON AND BACK

Catching up with Calgary Stampede's 2023 Parade Marshal

When Jeremy Hansen led the Calgary Stampede Parade down 9th Avenue on July 7, 2023, he was already destined for something extraordinary. Announced as the 2023 Parade Marshal just weeks before Stampede, Hansen was on the cusp of becoming the first Canadian to venture to the Moon as part of the historic Artemis II mission. Calgary sent him off in style – and the world watched what happened next.

On April 1, 2026, Hansen launched as a mission specialist on Artemis II, flew around the Moon on April 6, and returned to Earth via splashdown in the Pacific Ocean on April 10. In doing so, he became the first non-American to travel beyond low Earth orbit and set the human spaceflight distance record along with his crewmates, travelling 406,771 kilometres from Earth. It's a long way from 9th Avenue – but the values that brought him to Calgary in 2023 are the same ones that carried him to the Moon.

Hansen's path to space has deep Alberta roots – he completed his CF-18 fighter jet training in Cold Lake before joining the Canadian Space Agency, and like so many Parade Pacers who line the route each year, his journey began as a cadet. He joined the Air Cadets at the age of 12.

Reflecting on the mission after returning to Earth, Hansen said he hopes it inspires Canada to aim higher. "What this should do is shine a spotlight on what we're capable of as a country," he said. "We need to do big things. We need to set big goals."*

Stampede couldn't agree more. We're proud to have cheered him on from the very beginning.

HONOURING THE FIRST NATIONS OF TREATY 7:

A Tradition at the Heart of the Calgary Stampede

Since the very first Calgary Stampede in 1912, the First Nations of Treaty 7 have played an essential role in shaping the spirit and identity of the celebration. What began more than a century ago as an invitation for Indigenous First Nations to share their cultures, traditions, and horsemanship has grown into one of the Stampede's most cherished and enduring relationships.

At the inaugural Stampede, approximately 1,800 First Nations participants travelled to Calgary to take part in the festivities. They captivated audiences by riding in the parade, competing in rodeo events, and establishing traditional tipi camps on Stampede Park. Their contributions became an unforgettable part of Stampede history, highlighted by Tom Three Persons of the Kainai Nation, who earned the title of World Champion Cowboy after conquering the legendary bronco Cyclone.

Today, that legacy continues through the vibrant presence of the Treaty 7 Nations: the Kainai, Piikani, Siksika, Tsuut'ina, and Stoney Nakoda First Nations. Their participation remains a cornerstone of both the Calgary Stampede Parade and Elbow River Camp, where culture, history, and community come together in a meaningful celebration of First Nations heritage.

As part of the 2026 Calgary Stampede Parade, representatives from Elbow River Camp will proudly take their place in the procession in the following order:

- **Tsuut'ina Nation**
- **Stoney Nakoda Nation (Bears paw, Chiniki, and Goodstoney Nations)**
- **Siksika Nation**
- **Kainai Nation**
- **Piikani Nation**

At Elbow River Camp, presented by Enbridge, visitors are invited to experience the cultures and traditions of the Treaty 7 First Nations firsthand. Across 26 beautifully painted tipis, guests can connect with the Tipi Holders, learn about traditional and contemporary ways of life, enjoy cultural demonstrations and powwow performances, browse handcrafted artwork and jewelry from local artisans, and savour traditional foods such as bannock and saskatoon berry jam.

More than an attraction, Elbow River Camp is a living celebration of the stories, traditions, and enduring contributions of the First Nations of Treaty 7. It offers Stampede guests a unique opportunity to learn, connect, and honour the cultures that have been woven into the fabric of the Calgary Stampede for over 100 years.

GIRL GUIDE TRADITION

New Calgary Stampede Parade Crest Honours Decades of Girl Guide Tradition

For nearly 80 years, the Girl Guides of Canada have played a special role in one of Calgary's most cherished traditions - the Calgary Stampede Parade presented by Suncor.

Since 1946, Girl Guides have proudly participated in the Parade, helping showcase award-winning entries by carrying banners along the route and contributing to the pageantry that marks the official start of The Greatest Outdoor Show on Earth.

This year, that longstanding commitment is being recognized in a new way.

For the first time, participating Girl Guides will have the opportunity to earn an official Calgary Stampede Parade crest, a recognition that celebrates their contribution to the Parade and the Calgary Stampede.

"It is very exciting for us and the Girl Guides are thrilled about it," said Christina Smith, a 13-year Stampede Parade volunteer who spearheaded the initiative. "This is a very important recognition of the role of Girl Guides and celebrates their commitment to community service and volunteerism. My hope is that it helps create future Stampede ambassadors and volunteers - young people who will take pride in earning this crest, develop a lifelong connection to the Calgary Stampede, and help carry this tradition forward for generations to come."

Smith understands the value of participation and achievement. An Olympian, she was one of the world's first female bobsleigh drivers and represented Canada at the 2002 Olympic Winter Games in Salt Lake City, USA.

Approximately 40 Girl Guides and leaders participate in the Parade each year, serving as banner carriers for entrant award winners and helping ensure one of Calgary's signature events runs smoothly. In recent years, participation has expanded beyond Canada, with Girl Guides travelling from countries such as the United Kingdom and Germany to take part in the unique volunteer opportunity.

For Smith, the new badge is about more than recognition. It is about creating a lasting connection between young people and a community tradition that has brought Calgarians together for generations. The new crest helps showcase Calgary's western heritage, encourages youth engagement and volunteerism, and introduces visitors from around the world to a unique Stampede experience.

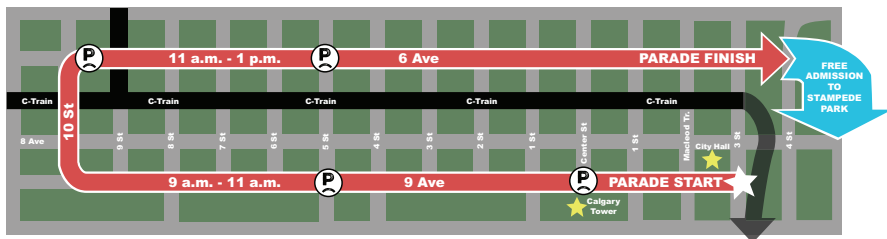

PARADE PRELUDE

The show before the show

Ask any Parade veteran and they'll tell you the same thing: if you're arriving at 9:00 a.m., you're already late.

The Calgary Stampede Parade Prelude is one of the city's most underrated experiences — a full, free, multi-location performance that transforms the Parade route into a celebration long before the first entry rounds the corner. While the crowds are still settling in, the Prelude is already underway.

WHAT IS THE PRELUDE? Once the Parade route is cleared of traffic at approximately 7:45 a.m., performers take up static positions at four key locations across the route. For roughly an hour, they perform for the gathering crowd — building energy, filling the streets with music and movement, and giving early arrivals a front-row experience that rivals the Parade itself.

WHO PERFORMS? The Prelude is a deliberate celebration of Calgary's diversity and western spirit — the same values that define the Parade itself. Performers range from cultural dance groups and marching bands to acrobats, cheer squads, and musical acts representing communities from across the city and beyond.

WHERE TO FIND THEM? Prelude performers appear at four locations across the route, so no matter where you stake your spot, the show comes to you.
