## San Francisco's November 5, 2024 Election

Question: Who is eligible to vote in San Francisco?

Answer: To vote in an election, you must first register to vote! You can register if you meet all of the following requirements. You are:

- a U.S. citizen
  - Some non-citizens may be eligible to vote for school board races but must fill out a different registration form at <a href="https://www.sf.gov/information/ncv-registration-forms">www.sf.gov/information/ncv-registration-forms</a>.
- 18 years or older on Election Day;
- not currently serving a state or federal prison term for the conviction of a felony
- not found by a court to be "mentally incompetent."

Question: How do I register to vote?

Answer: You have options. You can register online or by filling out a form available at many public locations before October 21, 2024.

After that, you can register at City Hall.

On Election Day, you can register at a poll site or City Hall. The poll site closest to Chinatown is the lobby of CCSF - Chinatown/North Beach Center (808 Kearny St).

Question: I moved after I registered to vote. Do I need to re-register?

Answer: Yes, you must re-register whether you moved within San Francisco or from elsewhere.

Question: Is it true that everyone who is registered to vote gets a ballot in the mail? Answer:

- Yes, if you are registered by October 21, 2024, the SF Department of Elections will send you a ballot in the mail.
- If you register to vote after October 21, 2024, you must go to your designated polling place or to City Hall to get your ballot and vote. You will receive information from the SF Department of Elections after you register.

Question: I got my ballot in the mail. How do I vote?

Answer: You have 3 options: by mail, using a secure drop box, or in-person. Please see back for details on how to vote.

Question: What if I don't get a ballot in the mail or if I run into problems while voting?

Answer: You can call the SF Department of Elections to request another ballot or to answer your questions about voting. At the poll site, you can ask poll workers for help.

If you do not receive a ballot before November 5, you can still vote by either going to your polling place or City Hall.

Question: Can I vote in a language other than English?

Answer: In San Francisco, ballots are available in Chinese, Spanish, and Tagalog. Sample reference ballots are available in Vietnamese, Korean, Japanese, Thai, and Burmese.
