The Historic New Orleans Collection is delighted to announce its annual international journey, which in 2026 will focus on the incredibly rich cultural heritage of Vietnam and Cambodia. Join us for an unforgettable journey to Southeast Asia's mainland—one of the world's most complex places. Marked by inestimable natural beauty, stunning architecture, numerous UNESCO World Heritage sites, painful tragedy and vibrant, resilient cultures, Vietnam and Cambodia will no doubt make a strong impression on you, and our experience will surely stay with you well after you return home. During our two-week sojourn, we will witness the most artistic, historic, and scenic areas of Vietnam and Cambodia and acquaint you with renowned historians, preservationists, chefs, craftspeople, and artists. We will enjoy music and dance performances, a cooking lesson with a renowned chef, and special tours with leading experts in their fields.

We begin in Hanoi, where we discover the grandeur of the former French Indochina and experience the bustle of daily life in the picturesque streets of Hanoi's French Quarter and Old Quarter. We travel to the former imperial capital city of Hue and explore the tombs of past emperors, which feature exquisite glass and ceramic mosaics—masterpieces of Vietnamese artisans. We then move south to Saigon, where we experience first-hand its industrial and artistic renaissance, and we visit places meaningful to the veterans in our group. The program concludes in Cambodia, where we commune with one of the world's greatest civilizations, the Khmer empire at Angkor.

OCTOBER 5, 2026

Departure from the United States

- Depart the United States on independent flights to Hanoi's Noi Bai International Airport (HAN).

OCTOBER 6, 2026

Arrivals in Hanoi, Vietnam

- Independent arrivals into Hanoi's Noi Bai International Airport (HAN). Participants who depart New Orleans on a morning flight on October 5 should arrive at the Hanoi airport (HAN) on October 6 in the evening.

- Pass through immigration and customs and meet an airport assistant who will accompany you to your private transfer from the airport to the hotel.
- Private group transfers will be provided for all guests arriving on October 6 and 7.
- Check into the hotel and retire for the night.

OCTOBER 7, 2026

Welcome to Hanoi

- Participants who depart New Orleans on an afternoon or evening flight on October 5 should arrive at the Hanoi airport (HAN) on October 7 in the morning.
- Pass through immigration and customs and meet an airport assistant who will accompany you to your private transfer from the airport to the hotel.
- Check into the hotel with a guaranteed early morning check-in.
- Enjoy breakfast at the hotel and a morning at leisure.
- An optional late morning excursion for travelers who feel rested to the Imperial Citadel of Thang Long, a UNESCO world heritage site featuring the foundations of royal palaces, ancient roads, and artifacts dating back to the 7th century. This site provides a rare, layered glimpse into Vietnam's political and cultural history.
- In the afternoon, meet your local Vietnamese guide and fellow travelers and set out on an orientation city tour. Explore the French Quarter, with its tree-lined boulevards, grand villas, and colonial landmarks.
- See remnants of Hanoi's colonial heritage reflecting nearly seven decades of French rule (1883–1954), which left a lasting imprint on the city's architecture, urban planning, and cultural institutions, including the exterior of the Hanoi Opera House, a mini replica of the Palais Garnier in Paris.
- Continue to Hanoi's Old Quarter. See timeworn temples, traditional tube houses, as well as postwar and contemporary dwellings and gain a better understanding of Hanoi's rich and complex evolution.
- Meet an acclaimed artist and art curator who will talk about the contemporary art installations along Phung Hung Street that he curated. These works offer vivid reflections of the city through the voices of its emerging generation of artists.
- Gather with fellow travelers for a festive welcome dinner at a top Hanoi restaurant in an elegant French villa that offers a contemporary approach to traditional Vietnamese cuisine.

OCTOBER 8, 2026

Hanoi—Dynastic & Religion Heritage

- Begin at the historic Temple of Literature, the seat of Vietnam's first university. Admire ancient Vietnamese architecture and hear how Confucian philosophy shaped Vietnam's

political and moral systems and how respect for hierarchy, education, and virtue were central to dynastic rule.

- Visit the Ba Dinh Square, where President Ho Chi Minh read the Proclamation of Independence on September 2, 1945 (now Vietnam National Day), giving birth to the People's Democratic Republic of Vietnam. See the monuments and historically important sites located around the square, including the exterior of the Ho Chi Minh Mausoleum, an imposing monument of marble and granite built to house the preserved body of Ho Chi Minh, and the nearby Ho Chi Minh House, a simple wooden home where Ho Chi Minh lived and worked.
- Special attention will be given to the One Pillar Pagoda, a Buddhist temple built in 1049 in the shape of a lotus blossom and set on a single stone pillar. It is one of Vietnam's most iconic and symbolic religious structures, both as a Buddhist monument and as a representation of Vietnam's dynastic legacy. Stroll through the magnificent gardens showcasing a wide variety of plants and flowers found throughout Vietnam.
- Following lunch at a local restaurant, gain a deeper understanding of Vietnam's rich religious and spiritual heritage. See the 6th-century Tran Quoc Pagoda, the country's oldest Buddhist pagoda beautifully located on a small island; the 11th-century Quan Thanh Temple dedicated to the Taoist god of the North; and the Tay Ho Palace, one of Hanoi's most sacred and active temples, representing Dao Mau traditions. The Dao Mau is an indigenous belief system unique to Vietnam, that revolves around the worship of a Mother Goddess and blends elements of animism, Taoism, and ancestor worship.
- At St. Joseph's Cathedral, admire its neo-Gothic French Catholic architecture and discuss the influence of the French Catholic culture on Vietnamese society.
- Enjoy an independent dinner and an evening at leisure.

—OR—

- Join an **optional** 3.5-hour food tour of the Old Quarter for an additional fee. Gain insight into Hanoian street food on a guided tour. Stop at a coffee shop to try the local brew. Taste typical Hanoian snacks such as pillow cake and fried sweet cakes. Walk through streets lined with food vendors tending steaming vats of pho ga (Vietnamese noodle soup with chicken). After experiencing Hanoi's insatiable demand for pho, move on to try Vietnam's second most popular food, the banh mi (baguette with paté) at one of Hanoi's most famous banh mi shops. Later head to Dong Xuan night market, well known for selling a variety of goods and souvenirs. Try your hand at bargaining before heading off to Beer Corner in the Old Quarter for a cold glass of Bia Hoi (fresh draft beer).

OCTOBER 9, 2026

Hanoi—Traditional and Colonial Heritages

- Spend the morning at the acclaimed Museum of Ethnology, which details the rich cultural heritage of Vietnam's 54 ethnic minority groups through its extensive collection of traditional costumes and jewelry, tribal art, everyday objects, and other artifacts. Surrounding the outside of the museum are several full-scale replicas of traditional village houses of various ethnic groups, particularly those of the northern and central highlands.
- Enjoy free time for shopping or further exploration in the museum.

- Following a delicious lunch in a local restaurant, experience the bustle of Hanoi's Old Quarter with a tour by cyclo (rickshaw). Glimpse narrow storefront houses and artisans making and selling their wares on your ride through a fascinating maze of picturesque back streets.
- Attend a water puppet performance, a uniquely northern Vietnamese art form said to have originated in the flooded rice fields of the Red River Delta. Modern performers stand chest-deep in water behind a screen and use long rods to move the colorful wooden puppets in a lifelike way to depict scenes based on Vietnamese folklore.
- Enjoy an independent dinner and an evening at leisure.

OCTOBER 10, 2026

Hanoi to Hue

- Fly from Hanoi to Hue, the former capital of Vietnam's imperial Nguyen dynasty from the 17th to the 19th centuries. *(Presently, there is a nonstop flight departing Hanoi at 10:40 am and landing in Hue at 11:55 am.)*
- Following lunch at a local restaurant, learn about the rise and fall of the Nguyen emperors, as well as the intense battles that befell the city of Hue, while touring the remains of Hue's Citadel, Imperial City, and Forbidden Purple City, where the emperor lived. Despite being heavily bombed during the American-Vietnam War, there are some incredibly well-preserved sections of the Imperial City intact and others which are being carefully restored.
- Check into the five-star Azerai La Residence, Hue, once the home of a French envoy.
- Meet a descendant of the Nguyen royal family, who will give an insightful lecture on Vietnam's last dynasty. Through personal stories and historical depth, she brings to life the legacy, culture, and inner world of the royal court.
- Enjoy an independent dinner and an evening at leisure.

OCTOBER 11, 2026

Monuments on the Perfume River

- Begin the morning with a boat ride across the Perfume River to Thien Mu Pagoda, Hue's best-preserved religious monument. Built in 1601, the seven-story tower pagoda is one of Vietnam's most recognizable icons. It is also known as the home of the Buddhist monk Thich Quang Duc, who immolated himself in Saigon in 1963 to protest the war; the Astin Martin car which brought him to the city is enshrined here.
- Drive through the jungle to explore the extravagant tombs of Hue's former emperors. Begin at the serene pavilions of the Tu Duc Royal Tomb, the most impressive of all the royal mausoleums in terms of size and luxuriousness. Tu Duc, who reigned from 1848 until his death in 1883, was the last of the Vietnamese monarchs to rule independently. He faced internal rebellion and French encroachment and eventually signed a treaty in 1861 allowing France to officially establish a protectorate over Vietnam.
- See the elaborate mausoleum of Khai Dinh. While smaller than many of the other tombs, the Khai Dinh Royal Tomb is more flamboyant, with the largest dragons in the country forming the side walls leading up to the tomb adorned by glass and ceramic mosaics. Khai Dinh ruled as emperor of Vietnam from 1916 to 1925 but was considered a puppet of

the French and was widely condemned by the public when he authorized the French to raise taxes on Vietnamese peasants in 1923, partly to pay for the construction of his palatial tomb.

- Enjoy a special lunch at a beautifully restored royal home.
- After a break at the hotel, transport back to Hue's imperial court and enjoy a sumptuous dinner fit for an emperor at Ancient Hue Restaurant. The restaurant meticulously simulates the ambiance of the royal palace, replete with royal costumes, music and performances, and authentic dishes of Hue's royalty.

OCTOBER 12, 2026

Ancient Village and Tea Traditions

- Venture 25 miles north of Hue to Phuoc Tich Village, a 500-hundred-year-old pottery village that is considered a national relic with more than 30 houses more than a century old. The village's ancient houses are built with beautiful carved wooden pillars and beams, and many feature beautiful communal courtyards. Take a stroll through the village and enter house museums that showcase antiques, ceramics, and other heirlooms.
- Meet a local family who will share insights about their life in the village, which has preserved many typical features of a traditional Vietnamese village.
- Savor a home-hosted lunch at a local's residence and observe the art of making a delectable lotus seed cake.
- On the way back to Hue, stop for a tea ceremony to learn about the importance of tea in Vietnamese culture. Hear about the traditional medicinal benefits and sample a range of teas, including Vietnam's rare and aromatic Snow Shan teas.
- Return to the hotel in the late afternoon.
- Enjoy an independent dinner and an evening at leisure.

OCTOBER 13, 2026

Hue to Saigon

- Fly from Hue to Ho Chi Minh City, still commonly referred to as Saigon. With over eight million inhabitants and four million motorbikes, Saigon is truly a city that never sleeps. Despite its modernity, Saigon maintains a strong link to the past, and the mixed identity of old Saigon and new Ho Chi Minh City is fascinating.
- Lunch is included at a favorite local restaurant, Old Compass Café.
- Embark on a combination walking and coach tour through the city in the company of an architect, and learn about the intertwined stories of politics, urban planning, and societal changes that define Saigon's architectural landscape. See French colonial buildings, including the Opera House, the Central Post Office, and the Notre Dame Cathedral, with their elegant facades and intricate details showcasing the influence of French design. Pass mid-20th century modernist architecture that represents Vietnam's industrialization and progress, and see the emergence of a modern Vietnamese architectural style. View contemporary skyscrapers that have transformed the city's skyline, reflecting the city's ambitions for economic growth and urban development. Exploring Saigon's architecture unravels a visual narrative, telling the stories of its past, its struggles, and its ability to adapt and evolve.

- Check into the five-star Sheraton Saigon Grand Opera Hotel in the afternoon.
- Enjoy an independent dinner and an evening at leisure.

OCTOBER 14, 2026

Cu Chi Tunnels

- This morning, board a chartered speedboat and journey 1.5 hours along the Saigon River. Watch the scenery transition from glittering skyscrapers and busy commercial centers to green paddy fields and small villages.
- Disembark at the famous Cu Chi Tunnels, a complex of underground tunnels and bunkers that was initially constructed in 1948 to protect the Viet Cong guerrillas from French air and ground sweeps. The tunnels then grew to serve as communication routes, storage facilities for food and weapon caches, as well as hospitals and living quarters for the Viet Cong throughout the American-Vietnam War.
- En route back to Saigon, stop for lunch at a local restaurant.
- Schedule permitting, meet a Vietnamese family of professional musicians to learn about and hear traditional Vietnamese music at Truc Mai Music House. The family is distinguished by having two generations of musicians awarded the title of Artist of Merit in the field of “Performing Vietnam Traditional Music” by the Vietnam government.
- Enjoy an independent dinner and an evening at leisure.

OCTOBER 15, 2026

Vietnamese Culinary Traditions

- This morning, delve into the art of Vietnamese cooking. Join a local chef on a visit to a vibrant central market and learn how to select fresh vegetables, spices, and other ingredients. At a private, hands-on cooking class, gain insight into ingredients and utensils often used in the Vietnamese kitchens while learning how to prepare dishes from Southern Vietnam, which you will later enjoy.
- The afternoon is free for independent pursuits.
- Reconvene in the evening for an amazing gala dinner at the former residence of the US Ambassador of South Vietnam in the early 1960s, Henry Cabot Lodge Jr. This enchanting villa is now a private residence and has been fully restored to its former glory, a beautiful mix of Vietnamese, French, and American architecture. Enjoy a reception complete with traditional Vietnamese dance performances in the intimate courtyard. A fusion of Vietnamese and Western cuisine will be served in the magnificent dining room accompanied by live music, creating a uniquely memorable atmosphere.

OCTOBER 16, 2026

Vietnam to Siem Reap, Cambodia

- Following a leisurely morning, check out of your hotel and transfer to the airport.
- After an independent lunch at the airport, take a midday flight from Saigon to Siem Reap. After passing through immigration and customs, meet your local Cambodian guide and transfer to the five-star Sofitel Angkor Phokeethra Golf and Spa Resort.

- Upon arrival at the hotel, enjoy a welcome with Chhayam dance, a traditional, lively, and comedic Khmer folk dance
- Check in, get settled in your room, and enjoy free time to explore the hotel's amenities.
- Dine together at a local restaurant built in the traditional style on stilts.

OCTOBER 17, 2026

The Angkor Temple Complex

- A rich, thought-provoking experience into Khmer art and mythology awaits you today. Begin your day early with an insightful tour of the Angkor temple complex, guided by a renowned professor, a leading expert on Khmer culture. Start at Bakong, a striking example of a mountain temple dedicated to Shiva and an excellent introduction to early Khmer monarchy and architecture.
- Continue to Angkor Wat, renowned for its intricate bas-reliefs depicting beautiful apsara dancers and ancient Hindu legends. Be amazed by the sheer size of the temple and learn how the Khmer Empire prospered between the 9th and 13th centuries.
- Your expert guide will explain why this was the first major temple dedicated to Vishnu and how its architecture reflects Hindu cosmic time, as well as presenting a deep analysis of its magnificent bas-reliefs.
- Following lunch at a local restaurant, continue to Angkor Thom, not a temple, but an entire walled city of nine square kilometers and the royal capital from 1181. With a population of one million, it was far bigger than any city in Europe at the time. The centerpiece is the Bayon temple, crowned with 216 giant, smiling faces of King Jayavarman VII. Also visit the Terrace of the Elephants and the Terrace of the Leper King, which houses almost perfectly preserved carvings.
- Return to the hotel in the late afternoon.
- Enjoy an independent dinner and an evening at leisure.

OCTOBER 18, 2026

Banteay Srei

- Set out for Banteay Srei temple, whose construction predates Angkor Wat. The area's only major temple that was not built by a monarch, Banteay Srei is dedicated to the Hindu god Shiva. Arguably the most beautiful of Angkor's temples, it is built of pink sandstone and is adorned with highly refined motifs. Banteay Srei translates to "citadel of the women" and is one of Angkor's most significant structures, as its walls are decorated with elaborate and well-preserved carvings.

CHOOSE AFTERNOON ACTIVITY:

- Visit Ta Prohm, built in 1186 as a Buddhist temple dedicated to the mother of Jayavarman VII. Unlike Angkor and the Bayon, Ta Prohm is preserved as the French 'discovered' it, with giant banyan trees growing in and through the monastery' walls, giving it a haunting yet exotic atmosphere.

—OR—

- Return to the hotel for an independent lunch and an afternoon at leisure.

—OR—

- Join an **optional** three-hour Tonlé Sap Lake cruise for an additional fee. Discover the floating villages and find out how communities live and work on the lake; see the floating schools, markets, and police stations, among other structures, as well as unique wildlife.
- Delight in an exclusive farewell dinner at the historic Prasat Kravan temple, a 10th-century masterpiece adorned with intricate sculptures honoring the Hindu god Vishnu. Enjoy authentic Cambodian cuisine accompanied by traditional cultural performances, creating an unforgettable ambiance for a truly remarkable dining experience. All in all, a magical evening!

- Check out of the hotel and take a group transfer to the Siem Reap airport for return flights to the United States.

Participants are responsible for their own air arrangements to Hanoi, Vietnam, and from Siem Reap, Cambodia. The three internal trip flights are included. **Please do not purchase airline tickets until the operation of the tour is confirmed by ISDI.**

Cancellation policy: Cancellation by participant must be made in writing to ISDI and is effective only upon acknowledged receipt by ISDI.

- Cancellations made on or before June 24, 2026, will forfeit \$1,000 of the \$1,500 deposit.
- Cancellations made between June 25, 2026, and August 20, 2026, will forfeit \$5,750 (50% of tour price).
- Cancellations made on or after August 21, 2026, will forfeit 100% of full amount.

Tour registration is nontransferable. In the case of cancellation, substitutions are not allowed. After the tour has commenced, no refunds will be issued for any reason including, but not limited to, unused portions of tour. If the tour is cancelled by ISDI or the Historic New Orleans Collection due to low enrollment, active registrants will receive a full refund of all tour payments.

Passports are required for travel to Vietnam and Cambodia. Passports must be valid for at least 6 months after the intended date of departure. They must also have been issued within the past 10 years. Please be aware that airlines may have additional restrictions on passports near their expiration dates. Please consult your airline.

Visas are required for US citizens to travel to Vietnam and Cambodia.

Terms & Conditions: ISDI strongly recommends that all tour participants be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and up to date with their boosters. Upon receipt of registration, ISDI will send registrant a Participant Tour Agreement detailing the full terms and conditions for this tour. This document must be signed and returned to ISDI before participant's registration is considered complete and any arrangements can be confirmed.
