



- DCSA provides 2 hours in person or virtual Memory Café staff/volunteer training

Volunteer Roles

Greeter

Assist in checking-in and getting name tags

Socialize, ensure everyone has someone to talk to

Set-up and take-down of the café (dependent on the specific café)

Assist in facilitation of the café (if interested)

Memory Café Kits

Every kit contains:

- Storage bin for supplies
- Tablecloths (reusable), plates, cups, napkins and silverware
- Decorations
- Gift cards to be used for refreshments and snacks
- Dementia/caregiver resources/information (handouts)
- Inclusion sign
- Name tags and pronoun stickers for staff, volunteers and attendees

Digital access to:

- Café Handbook/Guide
- Café Attendance Sheet
- Monthly Volunteer tracking sheets
- Café Participant Surveys
- Café Outreach and Advertising Resources
- Customizable Café flyer

Music Kit

- A variety of handheld musical instruments
- Digital sing-a-long template
- Electronic links to music themed games
- Vouchers for guest musicians & artists to perform at café

Arts & Crafts Kit

- A variety of art supplies (paper, coloring pencils, watercolors, craft supplies, stickers, etc.)
- Vouchers for guest artists and/or poets to facilitate café

Games & Activities Kit

- Supplies needed to conduct Bingo
- Additional assorted cards and game supplies
- Electronic links to online game formats such as Jeopardy and Wheel of Fortune
- Vouchers for guest performers to come to memory café such as magicians

Café Evaluation

- Surveys & attendance logs
 - Required to collect impact surveys for funders
 - Data aids in applying for other funding
- Survey about activities/interests
 - Done 2x a year
 - Gives us an idea of the activities that they have enjoyed, would like to see more or less of and helps plan for guest facilitators




- The fruit of the EMC2 strategic planning project for U.S. Memory Cafés

Pathways for Starting New Memory Cafés



Goal: Equitably and Sustainably Increase the number of Memory Cafés in the U.S. to 9,000!

Three Main Pathways


- **Individual self-directed pathway**
- Group self-directed pathway
- Cohort pathway

Considerations:


- How to reach under resourced communities
- How to continue nourishing the grassroots
- How to engage new sectors to get to 9,000
 - How to fund the administrative backbone
- Your feedback about training preferences

Individual User Pathway




Group Self-Directed Pathway

- Organized/led by experienced Memory Café Leader
- Useful in a specific sector or other group, e.g. a library system
- Live meetings wrap around self-paced training modules
- May obtain grant funding
- Encourage allocating some funds to support Dementia Friendly America's infrastructure



The limitations of first two pathways

- Individual and Group self-directed approach require “MC adjacency”



How do we THINK BIGGER – to equitably and sustainably scale access to Memory Cafes?

How do we engage more geographic areas, linguistic and cultural communities, and sectors?



Potential barriers

- Not currently connected with Memory Cafés or dementia friendly initiatives in general
- Stigma and lack of information about dementia
- Organization/community does not have enough funds or available staff
- Organization/community faces multiple stresses


Cohort Pathway

- Supported by **philanthropy**: potentially federal, state or regional funder
- Organized and facilitated by “Training Hub”
- Includes funds for Café Leader Trainee, Training Hub, and Dementia Friendly America infrastructure
- Live meetings wrap around self-paced training modules; 5 month process with a curriculum
- **Could be the “engine” to engage more geographic areas, linguistic and cultural communities, and sectors!**

Learning Community

- Percolator continues to host Google Group and idea exchanges.
- Toolkit and other resources still available for download. Information is being integrated into Training Modules.
- Anticipate an evolution of learning community as new resources come online
- Encourage all “Memory Café people” anywhere in the world to participate!



Public awareness campaign



- Only 4% of respondents to our November 2023 survey said that most of the public, health and social care providers are aware of Memory Cafes
- Our June 2024 survey focused on under resourced communities identified lack of familiarity with Memory Cafés as a major obstacle
- AARP’s Brain Health Resource Center focus groups showed lack of familiarity with Memory Cafes
- Percolator participants have identified outreach and attendance as their #1 challenge for the past 10 years

Public awareness campaign



- Target: Summer 2025, once Memory Café Directory and Training Modules are firmly established
- Resources:
 - PSA videos and tools for:
 - People living with cognitive changes and care partners
 - Prescribers
 - Potential Memory Café Leaders
 - Social media template
- Currently exploring options with potential partners

How each Memory Café Leader can help

- Register your Memory Café in the new Directory
- Download and add the MCA logo to your materials
- Encourage members of the public and providers to visit the Directory
- After February, encourage prospective Memory Café Leaders to utilize the Training Modules
- Stay tuned about how to participate in the Public Awareness Campaign
- Keep the feedback coming!




