RETURN DATE AND TIME

*Leave a copy of your float plan with your marina or a friend. Take a picture and send it by text or email so they can notify the Coast Guard if you do not return within a reasonable amount of time after your scheduled return date and time.

- Disconnect all utility lines, such as power cords and water lines.
- Take in all dock lines and fenders (protective devices used between the boat and other objects) except for those you will use in leaving the dock.
- Ensure engine cut-off switch is operable (if applicable).
- Check to ensure you have the correct number of extinguishers needed for the size of your boat. Review manufacture date to see if it complies with U.S. Coast Guard regulations.
- Instruct passengers and crew to keep hands, arms, etc., inside the boat.
- Sound proper whistle (horn) signals.
- After clearing the dock area, store lines and fenders and keep them clear of the propeller.
- Keep a lookout at all times for other boats, persons, and objects in the water.
- Keep a watch for low overhead wires.
- Proceed slowly whenever leaving or returning to a dock.
- Use just enough power to maintain control until in open water.
